DIFFICULT TO DIAGNOSE - AND IS OFTEN MISSED



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Adaptive functioning refers to the ability of a person to interact with the world and support oneself with or without supports Individuals with ASD may have differential adaptive ability versus intellectual ability

An individual with ASD may be highly intelligent with poor adaptive functioning.

CHALLENGES FOR THOSE ON THE SPECTRUM



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Sensory challenges - noise, smells, sounds	Communication -shame and embarrassment of disclosing a disability, expressing sexual needs
Norms in public vs. private spaces	Understanding non-verbal communication and verbal nuances
Dating and boundaries	Online issues



MORE VULNERABLE TO VICTIMIZATION

ASD individuals may be vulnerable to abuse and manipulation (may be naïve, may mimic others without realizing any issues in doing so, may not be able to tell if an intimate partner is lying or manipulating them, etc.)

ASD individuals may be victimized due to behavior perceived as antisocial



RESOURCES FOR STUDENTS

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ASD individuals benefit from instruction from individuals specialized in teaching ASD students ASD requires specific instruction on expectations of sexual behavior (informal social "rules," as well as legal expectations) as well as the reasons why social rules exist in society

SPECIFIC CHALLENGES IN THE TITLE IX PROCESS



HEALTHY SELF ADVOCACY

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Self-advocacy requires a student to communicate clearly and assert the student's interests, needs, and rights


